Niu Valley Neighborhood

- Niu, or "coconut," valley is nestled between 'Aina Haina and Kuli'ou'ou in East Honolulu
- Most of today's Niu Valley real estate originated from Alexander Adams, who was given the land from Kamehameha I
- Estate was held by granddaughter Mary Lucas, who subdivided the area in 1950s. The area created by the filling of Kūpapa Fishpond is now the site of numerous oceanfront homes.
- Offered as affordable homes in good proximity to town.
- Layout of single family residences large lots with wide streets.

Kuli'ou'ou Neighborhood

- Kuli'ou'ou meaning is sounding knee drum
- Kuli'ou'ou is nestled between Niu Valley and Hawaii Kai and was the site of a large coastal wetland and pool named 'Elelupe
- Kuli'ou'ou was known to be a dairy farm. Residents received daily milk delivery
- Most homes were built in the 1950s and 60s
- While primarily single family homes, there are 3 condominiums in Kuli'ou'ou –
 Haleloa, Haleloa 2 & Kuli'ou'ou Kai (all townhome style)

Early this morning, if all goes according to plan, a handful of Kulfu'or ou Valley residents will gather outside the house at 366 Kulf'ou'ou Road and proceed on foot to Nilecialotan Place, the dusty lane a short distance away. There, official greeter Keolani Noa, chanting in Hawaiian, will call out

neighbors one by one and welcome them into the fold.

The growing procession will continue on to the next lane, and then the next, calling out and

welcoming more and more neighbors, until, by the time it reaches Manukapu Place—three tenths of a mile from its starting point—the throng will number more than 150 people. Each one is linked to Charles Armistead Rosers and Rose

were married in 1903 and raised nine children. Reeves' descendants have scattered since the clan's begin nings. Amazingly, though, of the more than 500 kinfolk, 29 families still reside in 26 homes within the original nine-acre

one-family village.
Today's procession marks
the "10th Annual Reeves
'Ohana Kuli'ou'oulympies"—
the latest in a long line of excuses hatched by the family to
throw a reunion, July games,
eut lots of food and acquaint
younger members with their
relatives, post and oresent.

Of the hundreds of Reeves' family relatives who have scattered far and wide since the clan began in 1904, today 29 families in 26 homes still reside within the original nine-acre family homestead in Kuli ou'ou'valley — a virtual one family village.








Celebrities who lived in Hawaii Kai

- Origin as a Hawaiian fish pond, Kuapa or "wall of fish pond (523 acres). Largest among the Hawaiian islands
- Barrier built to farm mullet mullet can still be found throughout the marina
- Hawaii Kai is one of Oahu's premier planned communities, developed by Henry Kaiser in the 1950s.
- Hawaii Kai was formed by dredging and filling Kuapa Pond in 1959.

Dredging was a familiar sight to Hawaii Kai residents for many years




1961. Marina 1-E (area between Hawaii Kai Drive and Kawaihae Street). First Marina homes built on the undeveloped Kuapa Pond sold for as little as \$19,000



1961. Mr. and Mrs. Paul Clakins, center, are credited as being the first residents to move into Hawaii Kai



Hawaii was the first state to adopt a condominium law in the United State and Kaiser built the first low-rise condominiums in Hawaii, Terrace Lanais on Kawaihae Street



Few houses start to show up in Maunaloa Triangle in 1961

INTERESTING FACT

- 1960. First homes in the Maunalua Triangle ranged in price from \$40,000 to the low \$50,000's
- Hundreds of people came to see models but few bought
- Same happened when the first homes on the Marina were opened for inspection, starting at \$19,000.

Surveys indicated the public liked the houses and thought they were of good quality – but Hawaii Kai "was so far out of town". There was only a narrow two-lane road and they feared traffic congestion.






Historical Developments (Single-Family Homes + Condos: units built, %share)







Niu Valley + Kuliouou + Hawaii Kai Combined: Single-Family + Condo/Townhouse




Median Sales Price by TMK Area

Combined: Single-Family + Condo/Townhouse




Median Sales Price by Property Type Niu Valley + Kuliouou + Hawaii Kai




Percent Share of Sales by Price Range and Time Period





Closed Sales by Price Range and Time Period Niu Valley (TMK Area 137*)












Closed Sales by Price Range and Time Period Kuliouou (TMK Area 138)













